The number of parables depends upon the definition used for the word, "parable". Some contend for as high as 51 parables while others have them numbered as low as 27. Most listings show from 30 to 35 parables. The word, PARABOLE is translated "comparison" in Mark 4:30; "figure" in Hebrews 9:9; 11:19; "proverb" in Luke 4:23 and "parable" some 46 times. Of the many parables spoken by Jesus, less than 20 are **specifically** called "a parable" in the context. Also, on a few occasions the word "parable" is used in the sense of a pithy or obscure saying. Of the many parables, Jesus explained the meaning of The Sower and The Tares - herein is our guide and standard for the interpretation of the parables! Most of Jesus' parables are recorded in Matthew and Luke with the Book of John not having a single one.
